

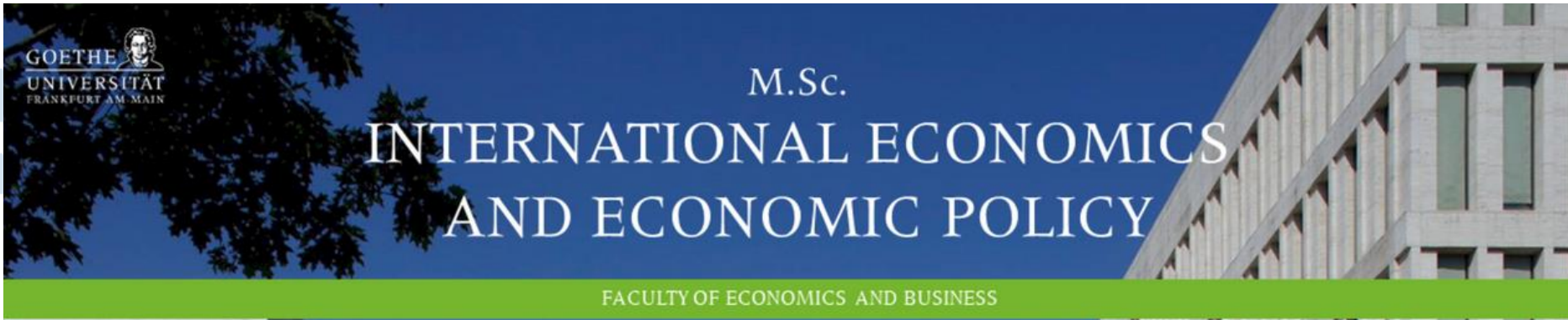

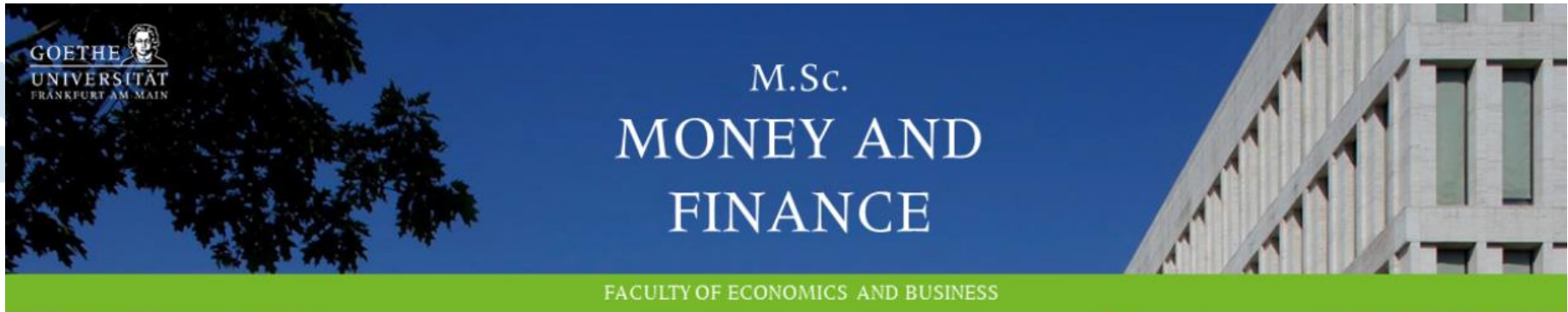

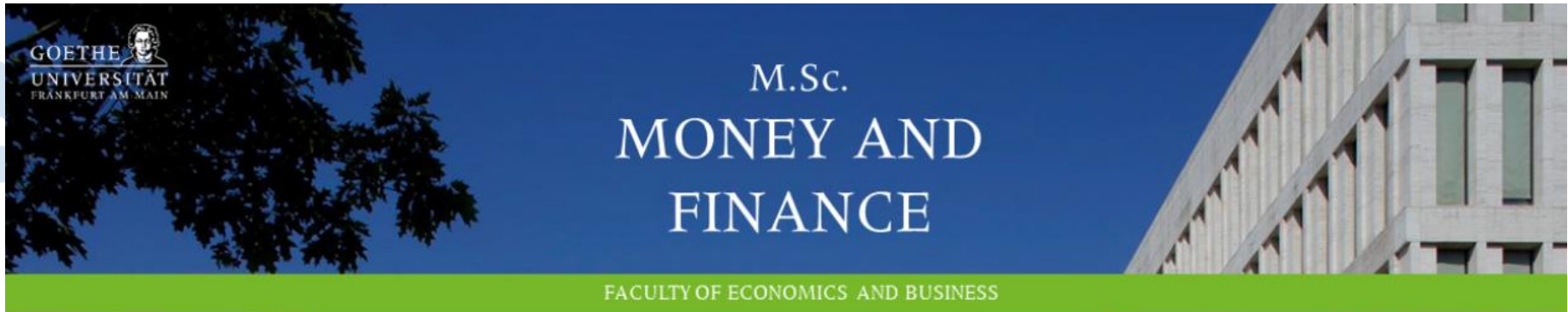

- i. Bachelor's degree in economics, finance or business administration or a similar subject providing proof of your analytical/ quantitative foundation (GPA 51%)
- ii. Motivational letter (15%)
- iii. Recommendation letter (15%)
- iv. Proof of quantitative skills (19%)

In order to evaluate these criteria the selection committee requires the following application documents. Please submit all documents via uni-assist. Applicants with a foreign degree must additionally send documents as (certified) hardcopies via postal mail. Please follow the instructions below. Missing documents and incomplete applications cannot be considered. Later submission after the deadline, May 15th, is not possible.
