

Call for Papers for Network F “**KITE: Knowledge, Innovation, Technology and Entrepreneurship**”,
SASE 2021 Annual Conference to be held online 3-5 July 2021

Our network focuses on innovation and entrepreneurship as well as its underlying technologies and knowledge sources. On these topics, we particularly welcome, but do not require an institutional perspective. We are a vibrant research network whose members come from all continents; we share and advance ideas on innovation and the dynamics of socio-economic change. We are interested in new methods that advance research, such as artificial intelligence, machine and deep learning, automated text analyses, big data analysis, and ethnographic analyses. Our network members are scholars at different stages of their careers undertaking research on different types of innovation and entrepreneurship as well as the various forms of technology and knowledge that develop, from a variety of perspectives, including institutional, strategic, managerial, ethnographic and behavioural approaches.

We are, therefore, particularly interested in contributions covering:

- Entrepreneurial ecosystems and their institutional foundations
- Markets for knowledge and technology, including the platform economy
- Institutional, socio-economic and frugal innovation and entrepreneurship
- Sustainability, eco-innovation and the socio-economic impact of innovation
- The management of innovation processes and information technologies
- Knowledge sourcing and university-industry linkages
- Local, regional and global systems and networks of innovation
- Entrepreneurship and social innovation
- Creativity and organizational development of innovative capabilities
- Technologies and knowledge work in institutional and socioeconomic context

The deadline for submissions is **January 16, 2021**.

Our network is looking for proposals for single paper submissions, for panels and/or network conferences (sequences of 2 or 3 panels). We do not, at this stage, require complete papers to be submitted; all you need to do is submit an extended abstract of no more than 500 words.
